



RESTAURANTS

ABOU EL SID Tel: 3603910	Naama Bay	Egyptian	Located above the Hard Rock Càfe in Naama Bay. Nice atmosphere, good service and varied Egyptian menu. It's more expensive than the Egyptian restaurants in the Old Town but a nice place for an evening out. Booking is recommended.
DANANEER Tel: 3600321	Naama Bay	Steak & Seafood	Centrally located in Naama Bay serving a variety of seafood dishes and good steaks (not as good as ours though!). Reasonably priced and good service. It can get busy so if you don't book you may have to wait for a while.
RANGOLI Tel: 3600081	Naama Bay	Indian	Located in the Sofitel Hotel. Fantastic views from the terrace overlooking Naama Bay and with good food, wine and service. Booking is recommended. Not cheap but generally good food.
SALA THAI Tel: 3601234	Naama Bay	Thai	Located within the Hyatt hotel and there is a dress code in place so a little bit of "smart / casual" is required! We still think this is the best Thai food in Sharm and they have a good selection of wines as well. Booking is essential and be prepared for a large bill!
SINAI STAR	Old Town (1st entrance)	Seafood	Use the first entrance to the Old Town then take the first road on the left and you will see the Sinai Star about 3 shops from the end. It's one of the oldest and best known "restaurants" in the Old Town - just ask for a seafood platter - and enjoy! We hear they also do a meat platter now but have not yet tried it.
FARES	Old Town (2nd entrance)	Seafood	Very popular with the locals. Take the second entrance into the Old Town and then the first turning on the left and its about two shops down. Very good food and very good prices. We like!
FISHERMANS	Old Town (1st entrance)	Seafood	Another favourite. Take the first entrance into the Old Town and this restaurant is located on the corner between the first and second roads. We've always had good meals here but be careful when they bring any appetizers - they are very good and you may then struggle to eat all of your main meal!
EL MASREIN Tel: 3662904	Old Town (2nd entrance)	Egyptian	Take the second entrance into the Old Town and you will see this on the corner facing the exit. A busy Egyptian restaurant serving good traditional food with a varied mix of meat, fish and vegetarian dishes. Good service, food and prices.

BARS

PIRATES BAR	Naama Bay	Located at the Hilton Fayrouz Hotel on Peace Road. Pirates is a well-known bar and our favourite in Naama; they serve a very good Long Island Iced Tea! They have outdoor and indoor (air-con) seating and serve a variety of snacks and meals. Always good service and only 15 minutes away from Sharks Bay.
THE TAVERN	Naama Bay	0127652800 The "Brit Bar" - if you are missing your sports action then this is the best place to watch it! Located in the pedestrianised area of Naama Bay just a short walk from the main taxi rank (ask us for more detailed directions). It has many screens to catch up on any football or rugby action that you might be missing and if you also miss your traditional Roast Dinner then this is definately the place to be on a Sunday evening! Booking for the "Sunday Roast" is essential.
CAMEL BAR	Naama Bay	The original "divers" bar located next to the Camel Hotel in Naama Bay. The interior has changed greatly over the years but the roof top bar is still a good place to chill out after a hard days diving.



SHOPPING

ALADIN <i>for gifts</i>	Naama Bay	A favourite of ours, located next to the Camel Bar and Hotel. A good gift shop to browse around without any hassle. They have a wide variety of traditional Egyptian arts and crafts and sell nice glassware, handbags, purses, jewellery and ornaments. Although they are more expensive than the shops in the Old Town their products are of good quality and well made.
TOO MANY TO MENTION!	Old Town - everywhere	For traditionally designed, locally made cushion covers, carpets, wall hangings and lamps as well as a wide variety of wood carvings, spices, gold and silver jewelry and good quality Egyptian cotton products, the Old Town is the best place to visit. The prices are much cheaper here and you can barter with the local shopkeepers for a good price.

ACTIVITIES

QUAD BIKING

After spending so many hours on and in the sea, a lot of our guests like to get adventurous in the desert. You have a choice of taking a single or double quad bike and can spend a few hours racing around the desert (with guides!) but be prepared to get very dusty!

MT SINAI
